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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 22nd, 1925

Returns received of the stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 22nd, 1925, show a decrease of 6,766,072 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 48,636,469 bushels; Oats 16,883,581 bushels; Barley 5,521,791 bushels; Flax 2,731,718 bushels; Rye 2,682,984 bushels; a total of 76,456,543 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the grains and were as follows:- Wheat 4,664,292 bushels; Oats 1,423,570 bushels; Barley 391,710 bushels, Flax 187,947 bushels and Rye 98,553 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 1,134,772 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 655,577 bushels; Oats 367,329 bushels; Barley 50,169 bushels; Flax 41,394 bushels, and Rye 20,303 bushels. There were 14,427,074 bushels in store compared with 15,561,846 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 352,146 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 238,005 bushels; Oats 63,957 bushels; Barley 29,410 bushels and Flax 774 bushels.

VANDERBILT TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 279,113 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 310,844 bushels, and Oats 1,129 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 32,860 bushels.



PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 4,299,046 bushels. U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- The grain stocks at these ports show a net decrease of 814,507 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 761,318 bushels; Oats 59,021 bushels and Rye 69,518 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 75,350 bushels.

DULUTH.- The rail receipts of bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending May 23rd, 1925, were as follows:- Wheat 12,288 bushels; Barley 1,736 bushels; Rye 3,240 bushels, a total of 17,264 bushels.
