CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 5th, 1925.

Returns received re the stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 5th, show a net decrease of 4,159,772 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 45,840,177 bushels; Oats 13,206,234 bushels; Barley 4,417,473 bushels; Flax 2,483,123 bushels; Rye 2,557,173 bushels; a total of 68,504,180 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,145,387 bushels; Oats 1,034,086 bushels; Barley 1,005,569 bushels; Flax 94,750 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 140,560 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a net increase of 42,219 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 192,917 bushels, while decreases are shown in Oats of 126,536 bushels; Barley 1,138 bushels; Flax 18,714 bushels and Rye 4,180 bushels. There were 13,551,018 bushels in store compared with 13,508,769 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on May 29th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). The stocks of grain in store show a decrease of 438,731 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 355,192 bushels; Oats 47,630 bushels; Barley 35,909 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 156,380 bushels. This increase is shown in Wheat and Oats viz. 151,359 and 5,021 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 515,807 bushels. Decreases are shown in Oats of 539,788 bushels; Barley 93,450 bushels; Flax 61,583 bushels, while increases are shown in Wheat of 172,189 bushels and Rye 11,830 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST ( U.S. GRAIN ). The U. S. grain in store shows an increase of 3,146,668 bushels over the same week last year. This increase is made up in the following grains: Wheat 804,707 bushels; Oats 382,117 bushels; Rye 1,493,735 bushels and Corn 460,109 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEAFOARD PORTS. - The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 591,463 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 322,391 bushels; Oats 198,003 bushels; Barley 95,010 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 23,941 bushels.

DULUTH. The rail receipts of bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending June 6th, 1925 were as follows: Wheat 16,702 bushels; Oats 15,039 bushels; Barley 3,715 bushels, a total of 35,456 bushels. The shipments were by Lake and amounted to Wheat 73,000 bushels.


