CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 19th, 1925

Returns received re the stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 19th, show a net decrease of 3,807,324 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 42,784,068 bushels; Oats 11,285,991 bushels; Barley 3,494,253 bushels; Flax 2,227,345 bushels; Rye 2,458,554 bushels, a total of 62,250,711 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,552,191 bushels; Oats 1,493,239 bushels; Barley 817,575 bushels; Rye 21,777 bushels, while Flax shows an increase of 77,458 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 282,783 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 202,006 bushels; Oats 31,259 bushels; Barley 12,904 bushels; Flax 29,220 bushels and Rye 7,399 bushels. There were 13,399,836 bushels in store compared with 13,682,524 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on June 12th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). The grain stocks show a decrease of 116,548 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 37,178 bushels; Oats 78,313 bushels; Barley 3,027 bushels and Flax 30 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. The quantity of grain in store shows a decrease of 13,039 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 7,960 bushels; Oats 1,952 bushels and Barley 3,177 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,234,389 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,166,193 bushels; Oats 942,237 bushels; Barley 230,342 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 42,072 and 12,831 bushels respectively.




