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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 26th, 1925.

Returns received re the stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 26th, show a decrease of 5,451,832 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 38,945,491 bushels; Oats 10,443,715 bushels; Barley 3,365,301 bushels; Flax 1,909,889 bushels; Rye 2,134,431 bushels; a total of 56,798,827 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,873,577 bushels; Oats 342,276 bushels; Barley 128,952 bushels; Flax 317,956 bushels and Rye 324,123 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 486,950 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 314,317 bushels; Oats 144,118 bushels; Flax 23,819 bushels and Rye 20,389 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 13,693 bushels. There were 12,910,886 bushels in the store this week compared with 13,399,836 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on June 19th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 96,735 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 25,553 bushels; Oats 65,457 bushels; Barley 5,624 bushels, and Flax 101 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. The quantity of grain in store shows a decrease of 314,586 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 313,445 bushels; Oats 488 bushels and Barley 653 bushels. The total grain receipts for the week were 42,143 bushels, while the shipments amounted to Vessel 301,899 bushels and Rail 36,628 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a decrease of 2,957,184 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 2,304,447 bushels; Oats 117,544 bushels; Barley 169,850 bushels; Flax 227,533 bushels and Rye 137,810 bushels.
