CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 10th, 1925.

Returns received re the stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 10th, 1925, show a decrease of 3,795,741 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 33,117,499 bushels; Oats 9,512,009 bushels; Barley 2,981,052 bushels; Flax 1,639,259 bushels; Rye 1,164,869 bushels; a total of 48,214,658 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,323,754 bushels; Oats 601,559 bushels; Barley 163,415 bushels; Flax 197,243 bushels and Rye 509,770 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,726,929 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,089,962 bushels; Oats 386,246 bushels; Barley 103,056 bushels; Flax 113,764 bushels; Rye 33,901 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 50,421 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,065 bushels; Oats 47,749 bushels and Barley 607 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. - The total grain in store shows a decrease of 385,736 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 380,099 bushels; Oats 5,430 bushels; Barley 207 bushels. The total grain receipts amounted to 46,126 bushels while the shipments were Vessel 401,351 bushels and the rail 30,011 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,795,038 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,112,372 bushels; Barley 207,544 bushels; Flaxseed 76,369 bushels and Rye 501,799 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. - Duluth and Buffalo:- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 434,908 bushels. Wheat and Barley show increases of 468,548 and 106,117 bushels respectively while Oats show a decrease of 89,757 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 4,743 bushels. The increases are shown in Wheat of 12,174 bushels and Barley 104,280 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 39,732 bushels and Rye 30,219 bushels.

DULUTH. - The rail receipts of bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending July 11th, 1925, were as follows:- Wheat 21,092 bushels; Oats 8,900 bushels; Barley 14,717 bushels; a total of 44,709 bushels. There was a receipt of 60,834 bushels of flaxseed by vessel. The shipments during the week were 122,475 bushels of Wheat by Vessel.


