CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 5th, 1924

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended September 5th, 1924, shows a net decrease of 5,978,646 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 16,925,041 bushels; Oats 13,884,147 bushels; Barley 1,077,982 bushels; Flax 169,351 bushels; Rye 2,214,069 bushels; a total of 34,270,590 bushels, compared with 38,249,236 bushels previous week. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,517,224 bushels; Oats 1,363,825 bushels; Barley 132,428 bushels; Flax 37,173 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 72,124 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 349,774 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 400,002 bushels; Oats 12,638 bushels; and Flax 4,243 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 10,045 bushels and Rye 57,064 bushels. The amount in store this week was 6,732,257 bushels compared with 7,082,031 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, western Ontario and British Columbia, on August 29th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period 1923.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW AND SASKATOON). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 44,492 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 44,512 bushels and Rye 1,092 bushels while Barley shows a decrease of 1,112 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. The grain in store shows a net increase of 52,752 bushels, wheat and Rye showing increases of 63,486 and 2,556 bushels respectively while Oats and Barley show decreases of 12,101 and 1,369 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM & PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,894,790 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,793,175 bushels; Oats 779,092 bushels; Flax 22,915 bushels and Rye 353,745 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 54,737 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 4,831 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 277 bushels; Oats 12,661 bushels; Barley 2,429 bushels; and Flax 15 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 20,213 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a decrease of 372,177 bushels from the previous week. The decreases were made up as follows:- Wheat 189,741 bushels; Oats 34,814 bushels; Barley 132,684 bushels; Flax 10,000 and Rye 4,938 bushels.

1,845,869 bushels and 121,661 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. Of the foregoing amounts 1,476,672 bushels 97,061 bushels was Wheat.

CANADIAN SEABOARD PORTS (MONTREAL AND QUEBEC). The stocks at the foregoing ports show a decrease of 316,223 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 112,070 bushels; Oats 113,585 bushels; Barley 75,690 bushels; Flax 10,000 bushels and Rye 4,938 bushels.

The shipments of Canadian grain overseas were as follows:- Wheat 1,060,896 bushels; Oats 73,824 bushels; Barley 179,277 bushels and Rye 27,515 bushels; a total of 1,341,512 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net increase of 152,310 bushels. Barley shows a decrease of 59,615 bushels while Wheat shows an increase of 39,141 bushels; Oats 124,704 bushels and Rye 4,020 bushels.


