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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 17th, 1925

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 17th, 1925, show a decrease of 5,487,557 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 23,591,480 bushels; Oats 3,857,266 bushels; Barley 2,539,021 bushels; Flax 1,575,103 bushels; and Rye 1,164,259 bushels; a total of 42,727,131 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 4,526,019 bushels; Oats 454,743 bushels; Barley 442,031 bushels; Flax 64,154 bushels and Rye 610 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,716,500 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,108,936 bushels; Oats 371,470 bushels; Barley 141,452 bushels; Flax 82,273 bushels and Rye 12,369 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON and EDMONTON). - A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 75,854 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 66,972 bushels; Oats 8,707 bushels; Barley 9 bushels and Rye 170 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 4 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. - The total grain in store shows a decrease of 625,551 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 612,879 bushels; Oats 10,439 bushels and Barley 2,183 bushels. The total grain received amounted to 58,276 bushels while the Shipments were 602,735 bushels by Vessel and 81,092 bushels by Rail.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,762,642 bushels. The decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,783,124 bushels; Barley 7,185 bushels and Rye 140,271 bushels while Oats and Flax show increases of 125,264 and 41,674 bushels respectively.
