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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 24th, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 24th, 1925, show a net decrease of 3,844,019 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 24,955,785 bushels; Oats 3,703,086 bushels; Barley 2,174,291 bushels; Flax 1,635,954 bushels and Rye 1,413,996 bushels; a total of 38,883,112 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,635,695 bushels; Oats 154,180 bushels; and Barley 364,730 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 60,849 and 249,737 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,440,949 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 686,606 bushels; Oats 481,728 bushels; Barley 160,112 bushels; Flax 83,354 bushels and Rye 29,143 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on July 17th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). - A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 221,632 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 212,395 bushels; Oats 6,348 bushels and Barley 2,889 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. - The total grain in store shows a decrease of 153,923 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 145,730 bushels; Oats 7,860 bushels and Barley 333 bushels. The total grain received amounted to 25,597 bushels, while the shipments were 147,653 bushels by vessel and 31,867 bushels by rail.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 2,926,347 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,025,761 bushels; Barley 24,078 bushels and Rye 886 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 64,841 bushels and Flax 59,537 bushels.



U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 79,709 bushels. Oats and Barley show decreases of 56,134 and 124,922 bushels respectively, while Wheat shows an increase of 101,347 bushels.

DULUTH. - The rail receipts of bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending July 25th, 1925, were as follows:- Wheat 3,877 bushels and Oats 2,686 bushels. The shipments by vessel were 34,361 bushels of Barley.
