CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 31st, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 31st, 1925, show a decrease of 4,730,396 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 21,505,981 bushels; Oats 8,047,164 bushels; Barley 2,133,182 bushels; Flax 1,483,300 bushels and Rye 983,089 bushels, a total of 34,152,716 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,449,804 bushels; Oats 655,922 bushels; Barley 41,109 bushels; Flax 152,654 bushels and Rye 430,907 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 647,381 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 243,291 bushels; Oats 259,466 bushels; Barley 89,780 bushels; Flax 37,798 bushels and Rye 12,046 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON).- A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 333,763 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 289,518 bushels; Oats 42,807 bushels and Barley 1,438 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 132,774 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 136,221 bushels; Barley 336 bushels and Flax 12 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 3,795 bushels. The total grain received amounted to 52,179 bushels, while 166,000 bushels by vessel and 18,953 bushels by rail, were shipped.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a decrease of 3,853,141 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 3,026,985 bushels; Oats 629,017 bushels; Barley 108,784 bushels; Flax 87,904 bushels and Rye 5,451 bushels.


