CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 19th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending September 19th, 1924 shows a net decrease of 1,066,437 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 11,762,972 bushels; Oats 13,520,889 bushels; Barley 1,571,157 bushels; Flax 153,975 bushels and Rye 2,271,548 bushels, a total of 29,280,541 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 1,710,939 bushels while Oats show an increase of 36,991 bushels; Barley 377,830 bushels; Flax 3,854 bushels and Rye 225,827 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The stocks in store show an increase of 1,150,273 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 923,266 bushels; Oats 27,901 bushels; Barley 132,104 bushels; Flax 2,928 bushels and Rye 45,934 bushels. There were 7,446,638 bushels of all grain in store compared with 6,316,365 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia, on September 12th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period 1923.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSJAW AND SASKATOON). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 11,919 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 15,447 bushels while decreases are shown in Oats of 1,979 bushels; Barley 1,043 bushels and Rye 506 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 14,713 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 8,870 bushels and Oats 5,843 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,042,852 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 778,625 bushels; Oats 501,656 bushels and Rye 63,546 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 299,849 bushels and Flax 926 bushels.

Note:- In connection with the foregoing statement of Receipts and Shipments at the Head of the Lakes and Vancouver it will be noted that the figures given above will not correspond to a total arrived at by adding the weekly amounts shown on page 7 of the Grain statistics. The reason being the weekly Receipts and Shipments include transfer of grain from one elevator to another.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG.) A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 5,288 bushels. Wheat and Rye show decreases of 1,919 bushels and 8,502 bushels respectively while Oats show an increase of 2,288 bushels and Barley 7,421 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 142,805 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 969,953 bushels and Rye 83,017 bushels while Wheat shows a decrease of 862,233 bushels and Barley 47,862 bushels.

5,013,089 bushels and 1,133,487 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. Of the foregoing amounts 3,393,992 bushels and 59,584 bushels were Wheat.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,337,137 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 956,750 bushels; Oats 371,946 bushels; and Rye 27,763 bushels while barley shows an increase of 19,264 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net increase of 37,989 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 41,205 bushels; Oats 81,817 bushels; and Barley 31,883 bushels while an increase of 192,835 bushels took place in Rye.



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
