CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 3rd, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending October 3rd, 1924, shows an increase of 9,707,764 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 20,184,745 bushels; Oats 12,339,386 bushels; Barley 4,029,741 bushels; Flax 243,301 bushels and Rye 3,142,627 bushels; a total of 40,439,200 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 7,341,223 bushels; Oats 137,598 bushels; Barley 1,659,049 bushels; Flax 101,234 bushels and Rye 218,660 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. An increase is shown in the total grain in store of 4,603,980 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 3,926,587 bushels; Oats 116,746 bushels; Barley 342,499 bushels; Flax 38,794 bushels; and Rye 129,360 bushels. The amount in store was 14,997,922 bushels compared with 10,393,936 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia, on September 26th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period 1923.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. There was an increase in the total grain in store of 30,626 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 20,564 bushels and Oats 10,042 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows an increase of 480,379 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 464,661 bushels; Oats 6,909 bushels; Barley 4,109 bushels and Rye 4,680 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (F. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 3,902,713 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 2,832,775 bushels; Oats 752,225 bushels; Barley 743,305 bushels and Flax 12,395 bushels while Rye shows a decrease of 37,957 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 28,608 bushels. Wheat and Barley show increases of 13,794 and 21,580 bushels respectively while decreases are shown in Oats of 3,538 bushels and Rye 3,273 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The stocks in the above elevators show a net increase of 606,260 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 83,371 and 206,224 bushels respectively while Barley shows an increase of 523,465 bushels and Rye 372,390 bushels.

5,510,657 and 1,360,362 bushels of all grains were received at the above elevators by Water and Rail respectively. Of the two amounts 3,218,188 and 659,836 bushels were Wheat.

The Shipments of Canadian grain overseas according to elevator returns for the week were as follows:- Wheat 1,765,990 bushels; Oats 740,893 bushels; Barley 133,378 bushels; Rye 120,046 bushels; a total of 2,760,307 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). There was a large increase in the total grain in store of 7,499,609 bushels over the same week during the previous year. These increases are made up as follows:- Wheat 2,029,479 bushels; Oats 413,985 bushels; Barley 41,958 bushels; Rye 4,140,054 bushels; Corn 874,155 bushels.

The Shipments of the above grain overseas according to elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 3,751,530 bushels; Corn 35,000 bushels; Rye 1,181,596 bushels; a total of 4,966,126 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. The quantity in store shows a net increase of 299,562 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 243,382 bushels and Barley 226,611 bushels while Oats show a decreases of 119,392 bushels and Rye 51,039 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The stocks at these ports show a net decrease of 244,570 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 77,209 bushels; Barley 2,520 bushels and Rye 195,471 bushels while Oats show an increase of 30,830 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded Grain at Duluth for the week ending September 27th 1924 were 126,041 bushels of Wheat; Oats 2,290 bushels; Barley 19,331 bushels and Rye 26,282 bushels by Rail. Shipments amounted to Wheat 126,000 bushels and Rye 55,000 bushels by Vessel for the period from September 1st, 1924 to September 27th, 1924, the Receipts and Shipments were as follows:-






