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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 9TH, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 9th, 1925, show an increase of 16,013,283 bushels over the previous week. The stocks of grain for the week were as follows:- Wheat 70,504,757 bushels; Oats 7,169,306 bushels; Barley 11,641,093 bushels; Flax 1,273,552 bushels; Rye 2,257,292 bushels; a total of 92,355,000 bushels. Increases are shown in all the grains made up as follows:- Wheat 13,356,023 bushels; Oats 1,213,023 bushels; Barley 982,053 bushels; Flax 317,110 bushels; Rye 145,063 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- An increase is shown in the total grain in store of 6,116,113 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 5,047,356 bushels; Oats 604,763 bushels; Barley 257,017 bushels; Flax 219,265 bushels; Rye 11,579 bushels. There were 41,619,811 bushels in store compared with 35,503,698 bushels last week.
