CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 16th, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 16th, 1925, show an increase of 3,948,546 bushels over the previous week. The stocks of grain for the week were as follows:- Wheat 72,871,569 bushels; Oats 7,796,864 bushels; Barley 12,440,345 bushels; Flax 1,284,789 bushels; Rye 2,409,979 bushels; a total of 96,803,546 bushels. Increases are shown in all grains made up as follows:- Wheat 2,366,812 bushels; Oats 627,558 bushels; Barley 795,252 bushels; Flax 6,237 bushels; Rye 152,627 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 273,441 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 319,358 bushels; Barley 113,771 bushels; Flax 21,331 bushels; Rye 11,026 bushels while Oats show an increase of 187,047 bushels. There were 41,341,370 bushels in store this week compared with 41,619,811 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on October 9th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, CALGARY & EDMONTON).- The grain stocks show a net decrease of 3,206 bushels. Decreases are shown in Oats of 4,681 bushels; Barley 1,322 bushels while Wheat shows an increase of 2,863 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 611,249 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 597,912 bushels and Oats 17,155 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 673 bushels; Flax 21 bushels and Rye 3,119 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,071,399 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 616,287 bushels; Barley 617,704 bushels; Flax 15,974 bushels while Oats show an increase of 44,215 bushels and Rye 134,351 bushels.

Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,326,836 bushels; Rye 6,462,152 bushels and Corn 515,690 bushels while increases are shown in Oats of 3,037,087 bushels and Barley 1,668,923 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. - The grain stocks show a net increase of 86,416 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 39,527 bushels and Barley 175,839 bushels while Wheat and Rye show decreases of 99,705 bushels and 29,545 bushels respectively.

DULUTH - During the week ended October 17th, 1925, the receipts of Canadian bonded grain by rail were as follows:- Wheat 125,474 bushels; Oats 76,452 bushels; Barley 240,390 bushels; Rye 33,108 bushels; Flax 11,960 bushels; a total of 547,384 bushels while the water receipts were Wheat 102,391 bushels. The shipments were by Lake and amounted to Wheat 111,000 bushels; Barley 125,500 bushels; a total of 236,500 bushels.


