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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 30th, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 30th, 1925, show a net increase of 3,194,190 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 75,939,603 bushels; Oats 8,153,377 bushels; Barley 12,386,260 bushels; Flax 1,504,317 bushels; Rye 2,182,230 bushels; a total of 100,165,787 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,958,349 bushels; Oats 892,818 bushels; Barley 228,922 bushels; Flax 308,348 bushels while Rye shows a decrease of 194,247 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- An increase is shown in the grain stocks of 950,402 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 100,032 bushels; Oats 399,622 bushels; Barley 234,088 bushels; Flax 202,339 bushels and Rye 14,321 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, CALGARY AND EDMONTON).- The total grain in store shows an increase of 112,833 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 82,690 bushels; Oats 82,329 bushels; Flax 824 bushels; Barley 7,930 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 729,919 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 734,249 bushels while Oats and Rye show decreases of 7,209 and 1,121 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 95,530 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 62,568 bushels; Barley 340,511 bushels; and Rye 214,986 bushels while Oats and Flax show increases of 448,458 and 74,027 bushels respectively.






