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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1925

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending Decemt 4<sup>th</sup>, 1925 show a net increase of 7,213,961 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 105,430,349 bushels; Oats 14,348,183 bushels; Barley 14,141,115 bushels; Rye 2,855,729 bushels; Flax 2,342,768 bushels, a total of 139,118,144 bushels. Increases are also shown in Wheat of 5,757,543 bushels; Oats 1,495,424 bushels; Barley 13,092 bushels and Rye 60,367 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 112,465 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 3,170,507 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 2,918,617 bushels; Oats 324,371 bushels and Rye 20,555 bushels, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 32,537 bushels and 60,199 bushels respectively. There were 56,915,280 bushels in store compared with 53,744,773 during the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on November 27th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 783,126 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 795,096 bushels and Flax 32 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 10,149 bushels; Barley 607 bushels and Rye 1,246 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 329,700 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 334,764 bushels, while decreases are noted in Oats of 4,577 bushels; Barley 419 bushels and Flax 68 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - The stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 8,471,431 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 7,480,319 bushels; Barley 935,380 bushels; Flax 193,040 bushels; Rye 57,774 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 135,082 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 913,564 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 843,489 bushels; Oats 69,485 bushels; Barley 3,590 bushels, while Rye shows decrease of 3,000 bushels.

DULUTH. - During the week ended December 5th, 1925, the receipts of Canadian bonded grain by rail were as follows:- Wheat 87,899 bushels; Oats 22,890 bushels; Barley 65,370 bushels; Rye 6,859 bushels and Flax 6,833 bushels, a total of 189,851 bushels. The water shipments were Wheat 73,440 bushels and Barley 76,962 bushels.






