CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 11th, 1925

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 11th, 1925, show an increase of 10,786,927 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 113,096,868 bushels; Oats 16,162,837 bushels; Barley 15,356,725 bushels; Flax 2,934,246 bushels; Rye 2,354,395 bushels; a total of 149,905,071 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 7,666,519 bushels; Oats 1,814,654 bushels; Barley 1,215,610 bushels; Flax 73,517 bushels and Rye 11,627 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 458,815 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 769,795 bushels and Flax 16,491 bushels while Oats show an increase of 215,490 bushels; Barley 73,588 bushels and Rye 38,393 bushels. There were 56,456,465 bushels in store compared with 56,915,280 bushels during the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on December 4th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 196,705 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 241,041 bushels; Flax 229 bushels; Rye 185 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 39,735 bushels and Barley 5,015 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a net increase of 148,133 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 153,364 bushels; Barley 1,561 bushels and Rye 2,149 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 8,941 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- A net decrease is shown in the grain stocks of 722,826 bushels; Decreases are shown in Wheat of 126,932 bushels; Barley 744,254 bushels; Rye 5,347 bushels while Oats and Flax show increases of 31,587 bushels and 122,130 bushels respectively.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- An increase is shown in the Canadian grain in store of 2,273,000 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,766,774 bushels; Oats 68 bushels; Barley 506,158 bushels.

DULUTH.- During the week ended December 12th, 1925, the receipts of Canadian bonded grain by rail were as follows:- Wheat 46,950 bushels; Oats 22,590 bushels; Barley 30,301 bushels; Rye 4,948 bushels and Flax 1,191 bushels; a total of 105,980 bushels. There was also a water Receipt of 22,691 bushels of flaxseed. The water Shipments were Wheat 177,529 bushels; Oats 64,521 bushels; Barley 72,054 bushels; Rye 28,172 bushels; a total of 342,276 bushels.
