CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 14th, 1925

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 14th, 1925, show a decrease of 3,333,506 bushels from the previous week. The stocks were as follows:- Wheat 15,266,111 bushels; Oats 5,933,036 bushels; Barley 1,607,353 bushels; Flaxseed 1,190,249 bushels; Rye 471,552 bushels, a total of 24,460,351 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,501,264 bushels; Oats 162,330 bushels; Barley 441,155 bushels; Flax 155,630 bushels and Rye 53,127 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,603,172 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 1,609,138 bushels; Oats 913,243 bushels; Barley 56,441 bushels; Flax 28,357 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 4,007 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). - The total grain in stock shows a net decrease of 56,687 bushels. Wheat and Oats show a decrease of 31,379 bushels and 30,576 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 3,268 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 69,959 bushels. An increase is shown in Wheat of 106,037 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 24,919 bushels; Barley 11,091 bushels and Flax 68 bushels.

The total grain received at the elevators during the week were 231,180 bushels, while the shipments were 91,548 bushels by vessel and 69,673 bushels by rail.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - A decrease is shown in all grain in store at the Head of the Lakes of 3,231,921 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,365,132 bushels; Oats 335,082 bushels; Barley 193,724 bushels; Flax 202,122 bushels and Rye 135,811 bushels.
