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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 25th, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 25th 1925 show an increase of 12,825,157 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 131,083,108 bushels; Oats 19,194,507 bushels; Barley 16,300,072 bushels; Flax 3,230,972 bushels; Rye 2,680,281 bushels, a total of 172,483,940 bushels. Increases are shown in all the grains made up as follows:- Wheat 11,352,944 bushels; Oats 846,956 bushels; Barley 350,510 bushels; Flax 161,049 bushels and Rye 113,698 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net decrease of 3,113,280 bushels is shown in the stocks in store from the previous week. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,982,753 bushels; Oats 26,186 bushels; Barley 73,102 bushels; Flax 43,161 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 11,922 bushels. There were 49,847,241 bushels in store compared with 52,960,521 bushels last year.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on December 18th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). - A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 47,153 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 40,192 bushels; Oats 4,946 bushels; Barley 2,949 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 934 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 30,452 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 29,600 bushels; Oats 705 bushels and Flax 147 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - An increase is shown in the grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes amounting to 10,235,744 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 8,544,480 bushels; Oats 925,918 bushels; Barley 522,346 bushels; Flax 142,701 bushels, and Rye 100,299 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS.— The grain stocks show a net increase of 112,625 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 39,468 bushels; Oats 118,595 bushels, and Rye 904 bushels, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 37,999 bushels and 8,343 bushels respectively.



These decreases are made up as follows:- Wheat 2,001,425 bushels; Oats 701,601 bushels; Barley 391,500 bushels; Rye 3,999,888 bushels and Corn 968,887 bushels.

The shipments overseas from Canadian Atlantic Seaboard Ports were Wheat to United Kingdom 33,200 bushels and Other Countries 108,533 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS.- A net increase is shown in the total Canadian grain stocks of 415,775 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 205,474 bushels; Barley 211,229 bushels; Flax 2,256 bushels; Rye 1,501 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 604,635 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- The Canadian grain stocks show a net increase of 718,126 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 783,791 bushels; Oats 80,271 bushels; Rye 6 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 145,942 bushels.

Duluth.- During the week ended December 24th, 1925, the receipts of bonded grain at Duluth by rail were as follows; Wheat 34,564 bushels; Oats 8,659 bushels; Barley 14,640 bushels; Rye 1,501 bushels; Flax 2,256 bushels, a total of 61,620 bushels. The shipments by rail amounted to Oats 18,777 bushels; Barley 6,945 bushels, a total of 25,722 bushels.
