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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 1, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 1st, 1926, show a net decrease of 1,793,154 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 129,609,971 bushels; Oats 18,960,225 bushels; Barley 16,069,580 bushels; Flax 3,302,201 bushels; Rye 2,753,809 bushels, a total of 170,695,936 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,473,137 bushels; Oats of 234,272 bushels; Barley of 230,492 bushels, while increases are shown in Flax of 71,229 bushels and Rye of 75,528 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 3,341,017 bushels from the previous week. This decrease is made up as follows: Wheat 3,093,472 bushels; Oats 24,262 bushels; Barley 27,753 bushels; Flax 54,455 bushels; Rye 11,070 bushels. There were 46,506,224 bushels in store this week compared with 49,847,241 bushels during the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on December 23rd, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. - The grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,532,548 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,280,093 bushels; Barley 366,478 bushels, while Oats and Rye show increases of 1,879 and 2,144 bushels respectively.

DULUTH. - During the week ended December 31st, 1925, the receipts of bonded grain at Duluth by rail were as follows: Wheat 21,485 bushels; Oats 5,150 bushels; Barley 7,171 bushels; Rye 1,501 bushels, a total of 35,307 bushels. There were no shipments by vessel.




