CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 8th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 8th, 1926, show a net increase of 274,604 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 128,595,209 bushels; Oats 19,632,573 bushels; Barley 16,495,961 bushels; Flax 3,410,399 bushels; Rye 2,836,248 bushels, a total of 170,970,390 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 672,348 bushels; Barley 426,361 bushels; Flax 108,198 bushels; Rye 82,439 bushels, while Wheat shows a decrease of 1,014,762 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 3,057,463 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 2,826,625 bushels; Oats 102,196 bushels; Barley 61,773 bushels; Flax 50,053 bushels; Rye 16,816 bushels. There were 43,448,761 bushels in store compared with 46,506,224 bushels during the previous week.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (Calgary, Moose Jaw, Saskatoon and Edmonton).- A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 258,075 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 272,756 bushels; Barley 6,767 bushels; Flax 41 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 21,489 bushels.
