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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 22nd, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 22nd, 1926, show a net increase of 508,179 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 124,376,822 bushels; Oats 22,189,066 bushels; Barley 16,073,952 bushels; Flax 3,421,144 bushels; Rye 2,908,222 bushels; a total of 169,529,186 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 2,306,010 bushels; Barley 479,300 bushels; Flax 55,945 bushels; Rye 111,809 bushels; while Wheat shows a decrease of 2,444,885 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 2,397,923 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,712,515 bushels and Flax 20,545 bushels while increases are noted in Oats of 248,859 bushels; Barley 78,012 bushels and Rye 8,266 bushels.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- An increase is shown in the grain stocks of 650,086 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 5,3,830 bushels; Oats 53,368 bushels; Barley 47,519 bushels; Flax 2,333 bushels; Rye 5,036 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show an increase of 284,780 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 283,974 bushels and 806 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR).- The stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,994,846 bushels. 
