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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 29th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 29th, 1926, show a net increase of 388,141 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 120,734,997 bushels; Oats 20,904,234 bushels; Barley 16,124,360 bushels; Flax 3,407,242 bushels; Rye 2,970,212 bushels; a total of 164,141,045 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 3,641,825 bushels; Oats 1,284,832 bushels; Barley 509,572 bushels and Flax 13,902 bushels while Rye shows a decrease of 61,990 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 379,857 bushels. Wheat and Flax show decreases of 683,090 bushels and 6,311 bushels respectively, while increases are shown in Oats of 218,523 bushels; Barley 62,247 bushels and Rye 28,774 bushels. There were 37,762,656 bushels in store compared with 38,142,513 bushels last week.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - An increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 247,919 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 105,499 bushels; Oats 100,833 bushels; Barley 32,864 bushels; Flax 3,853 bushels and Rye 4,870 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 452,828 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 447,670 bushels; Oats 3,484 bushels; Barley 1,531 bushels and Flax 143 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - The grain stocks show a net increase of 986,894 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 733,228 bushels; Oats 99,456 bushels; Barley 124,814 bushels; Flax 33,188 bushels; while Rye shows a decrease of 3,792 bushels.




