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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 12th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 12th, 1926, show a net increase of 59,373 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 116,024,979 bushels; Oats 22,593,733 bushels; Barley 15,875,590 bushels; Flax 3,400,875 bushels; Rye 2,936,507 bushels; a total of 160,831,684 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 951,568 bushels; Flax 28,708 bushels; and Rye 19,433 bushels while decreases are noted in Wheat of 786,403 bushels and Barley 153,933 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a net increase of 503,133 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 68,866 bushels; Oats 256,649 bushels; Barley 151,237 bushels and Rye 28,885 bushels. Flax shows a decrease of 2,504 bushels. There were 38,225,998 bushels in store compared with 37,722,865 bushels last week.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, CALGARY, EDMONTON AND WINNIPEG).-

An increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 869,497 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 470,760 bushels; Oats 317,036 bushels; Barley 58,669 bushels; Flax 12,688 bushels and Rye 10,344 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a net decrease of 28,028 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 40,336 bushels; Barley 209 bushels; Flax 80 bushels and Rye 1,043 bushels while Oats show an increase of 13,640 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- The stocks at the Head of the Lakes show an increase of 772,744 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 679,050 bushels; Oats 31,246 bushels; Barley 22,013 bushels; Flax 30,099 bushels and Rye 10,336 bushels.
