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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 19, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 19, 1926 show a net increase of 791,449 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 116,693,785 bushels; Oats 22,759,958 bushels; Barley 15,718,962 bushels; Flax 3,416,013 bushels; Rye 7,934,415 bushels; a total of 161,623,133 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 668,306 bushels; Oats 166,225 bushels; Flax 15,138 bushels and Rye 97,908 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 156,623 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - An increase is shown in the grain stocks of 1,082,251 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 519,249 bushels; Oats 334,497 bushels; Barley 159,044 bushels; Flax 11,109 bushels, and Rye 38,353 bushels. There were 39,308,249 bushels in store compared with 38,225,998 bushels last week.
