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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 21st, 1925

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 21st, 1925, show a net decrease of 5,721,230 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 10,783,465 bushels; Oats 4,932,637 bushels; Barley 1,423,440 bushels; Flax 596,530 bushels; Rye 655,825 bushels; a total of 18,747,071 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 4,432,626 bushels; Oats 950,449 bushels; Barley 178,913 bushels; Flax 293,569 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 137,277 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 72,810 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 54,842 bushels; Oats 43,686 bushels; and Flax 1,424 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 4,156 bushels and Rye 22,934 bushels. There were 2,485,404 bushels in store compared with 2,558,214 bushels for the previous week.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). - A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 11,362 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat-1,090 bushels; Oats 8,810 bushels; Barley 1,462 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 338,726 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 337,255 bushels and Barley 1,898 bushels while Oats show an increase of 437 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,521,076 bushels.
