

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 26th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 26th, 1926 show a net decrease of 1,005,042 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 115,459,619 bushels; Oats 22,744,495 bushels; Barley 15,922,986 bushels; Flax 3,452,443 bushels; Rye 3,058,233 bushels; a total of 160,612,091 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,234,166 bushels and Oats 15,463 bushels while increases are shown in Barley of 204,034 bushels; Flax 16,735 bushels and Rye 25,818 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 367,402 bushels. Increases are shown in all grains except wheat which shows a decrease of 272,909 bushels. The increase in the other grains was made up as follows:- Oats 348,062 bushels; Parley 250,008 bushels; Flax 9,837 bushels; Rye 32,404 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on February 19th, 1926, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1925.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON, CALGARY, EDMONTON AND WINNIPEG). - An increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 345,0 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 156,183 bushels; Oats 128,564 bushels; Barley 46,631 bushels; Flax 5,618 bushels and Rye 8,076 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - An increase of 56,728 bushels is shown in grain stocks made up as follows:- Wheat 55,192 bushels; Oats 1,322 bushels and Barley 214 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes of 387,291 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 484,304 bushels; Oats 28,330 bushels; Flax 13,690 bushels; and Rye 21,381 bushels while Barley shows a decrease of 160,414 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS.- A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 219,960 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 77,703 bushels; Oats 52,534 bushels; Barley 90,597 bushels and Rye 600 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 1,474 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S.GRAIN). - A decrease is shown of 6,520,495 bushels in the total U. S. grain stocks in store in Canada compared with the same period last year. This decrease took place in the following grains:- Wheat 949,942 bushels; Oats 1,139,279 bushels; Barley 262,596 bushels; Rye 3,387,808 bushels and Corn 780,870 bushels.

Included in the above are 58,915 bushels of Argentine Corn and 2,530 bushels of Australian corn.

There was a shipment of 45,690 bushels of Wheat to the United Kingdom and 340,655 bushels to other countries during the week.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. - The amount of Canadian grain in store and afloat shows a net decrease of 878,846 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 700,220 bushels; Oats 197,397 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 18,771 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. - The Canadian grain in these ports show a net increase of 135,718 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 47,808 bushels; Oats 61,646 bushels and Rye 5,123 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 250,295 bushels.

DULUTH. - The Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth were as follows:- Wheat 4,494 bushels; Barley 4,404 bushels; a total of 8,898 bushels. There was one shipment of 57,112 bushels of Barley by rail. This was for the week ended Feb. 27th, 1926.

CANADIAN GRAIN IN STORE - COMPARATIVE STATEMENT - 1921 to 1926


