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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 5, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 5, 1926 show a net decrease of 2,489,941 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 113,450,557 bushels; Oats 22,770,684 bushels; Barley 15,406,845 bushels; Flax 3,436,040 bushels; Rye 3,064,024 bushels, a total of 153,128,160 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,009,062 bushels; Barley 516,151 bushels; while increases are shown in Oats of 26,189 bushels; Flax 3,292 bushels and Rye 5,791 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 292,078 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 237,819 bushels; Barley 172,689 bushels; Flax 6,100 bushels, and Rye 38,760, while Wheat shows a decrease of 119,290 bushels. There were 39,967,729 bushels in store compared with 39,675,651 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on February 26th, 1926, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1925.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS, (MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON, EDMONTON, CALGARY and WINNIPEG.) The grain stocks show a net increase of 81,810 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 54,484 bushels; Barley 32,278 bushels; Flax 2,312 bushels; Rye 5,242 bushels, while Wheat shows a decrease of 12,966 bushels.


