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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 19, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 19, 1926 show a net decrease of 2,605,644 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 108,867,120 bushels; Oats 22,324,728 bushels; Barley 15,442,958 bushels; Flax 3,521,892 bushels; Rye 3,079,206 bushels; a total of 153,235,904 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 2,355,223 bushels; Oats 156,908 bushels; and Rye 176,817 bushels while increases are shown in Barley of 54,209 bushels and Flax of 29,095 bushels.

**WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.** - Grain stocks show a net decrease of 100,218 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 133,025 bushels, while increases are shown in Oats of 15,124 bushels; Barley 3,858 bushels; Flax 7,824 bushels; and Rye 6,001 bushels.



**INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND WINNIPEG).** - The stocks show a net increase of 62,260 bushels. Increases are shown in all the course grains and are made up as follows:- Oats 127,846 bushels; Barley 50,782 bushels; Flax 3,424 bushels and Rye 3,372 bushels; Wheat shows a decrease of 123,164 bushels.

**VANCOUVER TERMINAL PRIVATE ELEVATORS.** - A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 295,023 bushels; Wheat shows an increase of 316,793 bushels. Decreases are noted in Oats of 19,945 bushels; Barley 1,815 bushels and Flax 10 bushels.

**PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).** - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 542,224 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 453,794 bushels; Barley 71,288 bushels; Flax 13,138 bushels; Rye 14,280 bushels while Oats shows a decrease of 10,276 bushels.


