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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 9th, 1926

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 9th 1926 show a net decrease of 2,753,991 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 99,981,942 bushels; Oats 20,930,775 bushels; Barley 14,895,134 bushels; Flax 3,594,268 bushels and Rye 3,144,231 bushels; a total of 142,546,350 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,398,578 bushels; Oats 254,826 bushels and Barley 127,617 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 13,185 and 13,845 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks show a net decrease of 690,681 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 547,331 bushels; Oats 160,670 bushels; Flax 1,287 bushels and Rye 1,009 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 22,616 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on April 2nd, 1926, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1925.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOCSE JAW, EDMONTON AND WINNIPEG). - A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 56,420 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 81,944 bushels; Barley 9,447 bushels and Flax 1,212 bushels. Oats and Rye show increases of 26,590 and 9,593 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the grain stocks of 128,262 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 101,870 bushels; Oats 25,049 bushels and Barley 1,343 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes of 148,960 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 155,995 bushels and Barley 14,691 bushels, while increases are shown in Oats of 196 bushels; Flax 21,270 bushels and Rye 300 bushels.


