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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 23, 1926

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 23, 1926, show a net decrease of 4,024,026 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 95,122,259 bushels; Oats 19,823,625 bushels; Barley 14,152,525 bushels; Flax 3,605,912 bushels and Rye 3,067,274 bushels; a total of 135,771,655 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,160,551 bushels; Oats 533,931 bushels; Barley 121,083 bushels and Rye 223,333 bushels; while Flax shows an increase of 14,872 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 701,139 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 450,267 bushels; Oats 196,371 bushels; Barley 59,890 bushels and Rye 28,914 bushels; while Flax shows an increase of 14,303 bushels.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND WINNIPEG). A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 436,457 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 398,530 bushels; Oats 6,162 bushels; Barley 30,689 bushels and Rye 1,380 bushels, while Flax shows an increase of 304 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- A decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 501,510 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 495,532 bushels; Oats 5,065 bushels and Barley 713 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- An increase is shown in the total grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes of 194,582 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 110,998 bushels; Oats 15,064 bushels; Barley 57,655 bushels; Flax 6,437 bushels and Rye 4,428 bushels.



U. S. LAKE PORTS (Buffalo and Duluth).- The Canadian grain in store shows a net decrease of 278,709 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 561,865 bushels; Oats 57,810 bushels; Barley 115,826 bushels; Flax 5,638 bushels; while Rye shows an increase of 1,446 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- A net decrease is shown in the Canadian grain stocks of 413,133 bushels. Wheat and Rye show decreases of 278,709 and 199,196 bushels respectively, while increases are shown in Oats of 21,310 bushels and Barley 43,462 bushels.

DULUTH.- The quantity of grain received during the week ending April 24th, 1926, was Wheat 18,640 bushels; Oats 2,368 bushels; Rye 1,446 bushels; Barley 4,174 bushels; and Flaxseed 362 bushels; a total of 26,990 bushels. There was one shipment of flaxseed of 5,000 bushels.
