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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 28th, 1925

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 28th, 1925, show a decrease of 3,349,644 bushels from the previous week. The stocks were as follows: Wheat 3,822,455 bushels; Oats 3,322,658 bushels; Barley 1,294,269 bushels; Flax 860,360 bushels; Rye 597,675 bushels, a total of 15,397,427 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,961,030 bushels; Oats 1,159,979 bushels; Barley 134,171 bushels; Flax 36,320 bushels; Rye 58,144 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,423 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 61,755 bushels; Oats 90,100 bushels; Barley 11,137 bushels; Flax 13,538 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 42,311 bushels. There were 2,350,976 bushels of grain in store this week compared with 2,485,404 bushels last week.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 14,979 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 10,736 bushels; Oats 4,485 bushels; Flax 7 bushels; Rye 11 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 260 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 78,881 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 63,254 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 3,673 bushels and 700 bushels respectively. The receipts for the week were 32,914 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,173,604 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 956,439 bushels; Oats 249,913 bushels and Flax 40,981 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 31,490 bushels and Rye 52,239 bushels.




