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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 25th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 25th, 1926, show a net decrease of 3,103,557 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 43,062,892 bushels; Oats 12,622,502 bushels; Barley 8,221,963 bushels; Flax 3,127,187 bushels; Rye 2,306,220 bushels; a total of 69,340,764 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,221,343 bushels; Barley 328,840 bushels; Flax 9,527 bushels and Rye 136,725 bushels while Oats show an increase of 592,578 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a decrease of 2,353,108 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,683,164 bushels; Oats 355,545 bushels; Barley 156,957 bushels; Flax 87,033 bushels and Rye 70,409 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on June 18th, 1926, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1925.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (CALGARY, EDMONTON, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND WINNIPEG).- A decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 638,104 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 558,589 bushels; Oats 43,322 bushels; Barley 24,593 bushels; Flax 2,730 bushels and Rye 8,870 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a decrease of 452,545 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 448,704 bushels; Oats 2,834 bushels; and Barley 1,007 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR).- The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 3,613,635 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,191,526 bushels; Barley 489,352 bushels and Rye 52,441 bushels; while Oats and Flax show increases of 31,860 bushels and 87,824 bushels respectively.


