CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 2nd, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 2nd, 1926, show a decrease of 5,208,976 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:-

Wheat 40,057,216 bushels; Oats 11,233,747 bushels; Barley 7,586,726 bushels; Flax 3,051,489 bushels; Rye 2,202,610 bushels, a total of 64,131,788 bushels. Decreases were shown in all the grains and are made up as follows:- Wheat 3,005,676 bushels; Oats 1,388,755 bushels; Barley 635,237 bushels; Flax 75,698 bushels and Rye 103,610 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 1,337,843 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 754,716 bushels; Oats 298,518 bushels; Barley 145,722 bushels; Flax 89,159 bushels and Rye 39,728 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (CALGARY, EDMONTON, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND WINNIPEG). - A decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 84,965 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 55,856 bushels; Oats 4,200 bushels; Barley 8,758 bushels; Flax 15,720 bushels and Rye 431 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. - The grain stocks show a net decrease of 204,020 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat and Barley of 205,165 and 206 bushels respectively, while Oats show an increase of 1,351 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - A net decrease is shown in the grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes of 3,712,419 bushels.
