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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 9, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 9th, show a decrease of 6,258,693 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 36,837,343 bushels; Oats 10,246,244 bushels; Barley 6,035,379 bushels; Flax 2,955,827 bushels; Rye 1,558,302 bushels; a total of 57,873,095 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the grains made up as follows:- Wheat 3,219,873 bushels; Oats 747,503 bushels; Barley 1,551,347 bushels; Flax 95,562 bushels; Rye 644,303; a total of 6,258,693 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 534,488 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 347,147 bushels; Oats 159,529 bushels; Barley 51,230 bushels; Flax 9,839 bushels; Rye 16,743 bushels.






