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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 4th, 1925

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 4th, show a net increase of 240,351 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 8,292,016 bushels; Oats 3,830,894 bushels; Barley 1,733,521 bushels; Flax 902,153 bushels; Rye 879,214 bushels, a total of 15,657,778 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 8,236 bushels; Barley 49,252 bushels; Flax 41,773 bushels; Rye 281,529 bushels, while Wheat shows a decrease of 530,439 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - The grain stocks show a net increase of 545,588 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 339,048 bushels; Barley 152,063 bushels; Flax 1,297 bushels; Rye 77,565 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 24,365 bushels. There were 2,896,564 bushels in store compared with 2,350,976 bushels during the previous week.




