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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 23rd, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 23rd, 1926, show a net decrease of 1,948,560 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 34,018,252 bushels; Oats 9,683,200 bushels; Barley 5,397,523; Flax 2,920,841 bushels and Rye 964,173 bushels, making a total of 52,985,989 bushels.

Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,428,202 bushels; Barley 486,032 bushels; Flax 187,385 and Rye 55,579 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 208,638 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The grain stocks show a decrease of 943,022 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 476,743 bushels; Oats 243,662 bushels; Barley 147,938 bushels; Flax 48,279 and Rye 26,400 bushels.


