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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 30th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 23rd, 1926, show a net decrease of 3,777,925 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 30,761,214 bushels; Oats 9,976,442 bushels; Barley 4,668,967 bushels; Flax 2,563,371 bushels, Rye 1,211,070 bushels, a total of 49,196,064 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,257,038 bushels, Barley 723,556 bushels, Flax 352,470 bushels, while increases are shown in Oats and Rye of 303,242 and 246,897 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A decrease is shown in the grain stocks of 1,021,942 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 614,539 bushels; Oats 241,824 bushels; Barley 106,718 bushels; Flax 48,737 bushels and Rye 10,124 bushels.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). A decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 51,671 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 28,617 bushels; Oats 18,243 bushels; Barley 3,895 bushels; Flax 41 bushels and Rye 875 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 188,680 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat and Oats of 165,875 and 24,240 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 1,435 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 1,644,148 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 914,324 bushels; Barley 427,917 bushels; Flax 336,785 bushels and Rye 81,500 bushels, while an increase is shown in Oats of 116,378 bushels.




