CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 11th, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 11th, 1925, show a net increase of 12,449,008 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 19,390,313 bushels; Oats 5,513,582 bushels; Barley 2,968,895 bushels; Flax 755,751 bushels; Rye 1,158,245 bushels; a total of 28,086,786 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 11,098,297 bushels; Barley 1,235,374 bushels and Rye 279,031 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 17,312 bushels and Flax 146,382 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show an increase of 9,807,147 bushels over the previous week. Increases are shown in Wheat of 9,006,569 bushels; Oats 105,384 bushels; Barley 513,303 bushels; Flax 11,451 bushels and Rye 171,740 bushels. There were 12,704,711 bushels in store compared with 2,896,564 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on September 4th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON, CALGARY & EDMONTON).- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 581 bushels; Decreases are shown in Oats of 8,802 bushels and Barley 1,528 bushels while Wheat shows an increase of 9,749 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a net decrease of 364,979 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 357,167 bushels; Oats 8,494 bushels; Barley 436 bushels and Flax 1 bushel. Rye shows an increase of 1,121 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- A net increase of 4,103,630 bushels is shown in the total grain in store at the Head of the Lakes. Increases are shown in Wheat of 2,895,565 bushels; Oats 6,908 bushels; Barley 1,076,875 bushels and Rye 255,576 bushels while Flax shows a decrease of 174,294 bushels.


