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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 18th, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 18th, 1925, shows an increase of 12,413,651 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 23,257,279 bushels; Oats 4,181,474 bushels; Barley 5,553,455 bushels; Flax 326,653 bushels; Rye 1,681,570 bushels; a total of 40,500,437 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 8,866,966 bushels; Oats 367,392 bushels; Barley 2,584,560 bushels; Flax 70,908 bushels and Rye 523,325 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- The total quantity of grain in store shows an increase of 4,880,160 bushels over the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 3,845,559 bushels; Oats 512,235 bushels; Barley 620,069 bushels; Flax 39,357 bushels; Rye 62,923 bushels; There were 17,584,880 bushels in store compared with 12,704,711 bushels for the last week.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON, CALGARY, EDMONTON).- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 4,484 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 9,250 bushels while Oats and Barley show decreases of 3,442 and 1,304 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- There was an increase in the total grain in store of 99,174 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 88,580 bushels; Oats 4,903 bushels; Barley 5,572 bushels and Rye 119 bushels. The total grain receipts at the above elevators for the week were 102,705 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show an increase of 6,187,565 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 4,082,090 bushels; Oats 319,377 bushels; Barley 1,369,527 bushels; Flax 13,295 bushels; Rye 403,336 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SHIPPED PORTS.— The grain stocks show a net increase of 41,739 bushels. Wheat and Barley show increases of 45,807 bushels and 221 bushels respectively while Oats show a decrease of 559 bushels and Rye 3,730 bushels.


