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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 25th, 1925.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 25th, 1925, show a net increase of 17,976,011 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 42,609,757 bushels; Oats 4,851,034 bushels; Barley 8,385,399 bushels; Flax 806,436 bushels; Rye 1,823,762 bushels; a total of 58,476,448 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 14,352,473 bushels; Oats 669,620 bushels; Barley 2,831,944 bushels; Rye 142,192 bushels; while Flax shows a decrease of 20,223 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show an increase of 10,904,332 bushels over the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 9,073,539 bushels; Oats 559,217 bushels; Barley 1,080,850 bushels; Flax 96,457 bushels; Rye 53,969 bushels. There were 23,489,212 bushels in store compared with 17,584,880 bushels last week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on September 18th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERNAL TERMINAL ELEVATORS (MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON, CALGARY AND EDMONTON).- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 6,174 bushels. Oats and Barley show decreases of 15,573 bushels and 3,419 bushels respectively while Wheat and Rye show increases of 11,572 bushels and 1,245 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a net increase of 60,641 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 69,344 bushels; Oats 13,247 bushels and Barley 246 bushels while Rye shows a decrease of 2,196 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR).- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 3,725,731 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 2,540,209 bushels; Oats 285,363 bushels; Barley 1,014,593 bushels while Flax and Rye show decreases of 98,789 and 15,647 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a net increase of 388,414 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 441,497 bushels and Rye 3,628 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 52,365 bushels; Barley 3,403 bushels and Flax 943 bushels.
