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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - Week ending August 6th, 1926

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 6th, 1926, show a net decrease of 3,954,175 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 23,569,963 bushels; Oats 8,684,349 bushels; Barley 4,276,202 bushels; Flax 2,495,281 bushels and Rye 1,418,089 bushels, a total of 45,241,889 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,391,246 bushels; Oats 1,302,093 bushels; Barley 392,765 bushels and Flax 75,090 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 207,019 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is shown in the grain stocks of 560,320 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 210,673 bushels; Oats 162,448 bushels; Barley 145,818 bushels and Flax 42,598 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 1,217 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS, (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - A decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 39,319 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 7,608 bushels; Oats 30,100 bushels; Barley 1,096 bushels; Flax 502 bushels and Rye 13 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 9,341 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat and Flax of 21,452 and 137 bushels respectively, while Oats and Barley show increases of 10,595 and 1,653 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR). - A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 2,957,236 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,818,531 bushels; Oats 547,592 and Barley 809,759 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 5,359 and 13,257 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR, PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is noted in the total grain stocks of 151,774 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 100,619 bushels; Oats 9,651 bushels; Barley 35,076 bushels and Flax 7,258 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 830 bushels.






