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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 15th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 15, 1926, show a net increase of 6,781,085 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 57,920,047 bushels; Oats 7,581,691 bushels; Barley 10,291,058 bushels; Flax 1,519,554 and Rye 3,593,194 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 5,808,124 bushels; Oats 405,361 bushels; Barley 584,266 bushels and Rye 200,869 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 217,535 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 2,370,117 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 2,083,660 bushels; Oats 216,300 bushels; Barley 18,750 bushels and Flax 56,292 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 4,885 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- A net increase of 39,481 bushels is shown in the grain stocks. Increases are noted in Wheat and Oats of 36,267 and 4,743 bushels, respectively, while Barley shows a decrease of 1,529 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- A net increase is noted in the total grain stocks of 631,488 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 626,589 and 5,850 bushels, respectively, while Barley shows a decrease of 933 and Flax 18 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR).- Grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 169,811 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat and Flax of 696,723 and 263,869 bushels, respectively, while Oats show an increase of 64,109 bushels; Barley 502,302 and Rye 224,370 bushels.


