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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 22nd, 1926

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 22nd, 1926, show an increase of 14,460,279 bushels. The stocks were as follows:- Wheat 68,941,959 bushels; Oats 8,225,315 bushels; Barley 12,365,959 bushels; Flax 1,652,562 bushels and Rye 4,180,441 bushels; a total of 95,365,823 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 11,021,912 bushels; Oats 643,624 bushels; Barley 2,074,483 bushels; Flax 133,008 bushels and Rye 587,247 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- An increase is shown in the total grain stock of 5,184,531 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 4,045,020 bushels; Oats 401,035 bushels; Barley 376,225 bushels; Flax 271,507 and Rye 90,744 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAV, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- A net increase of 108,872 bushels is shown in the grain stocks. Increases are noted in Wheat and Oats of 90,018 and 20,040 bushels respectively while Rye shows a decrease of 1,136 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- A net increase is noted in the total grain stocks of 1,419,147 bushels. An increase of 1,421,741 bushels is shown in Wheat, while Oats show a decrease of 2,594 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS IN (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- Grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,814,617 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,425,135 bushels; Oats 105,890 bushels; Barley 332,916 bushels and Rye 121,596 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 170,920 bushels.




