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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 29th, 1926

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 29th, 1926, show a net increase of 14,739,392 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 82,722,539 bushels; Oats 8,931,942 bushels; Barley 11,968,869 bushels; Flax 2,075,521 bushels, Rye 4,406,344 bushels, a total of 110,105,215 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 13,780,580 bushels; Oats 706,627 bushels; Flax 422,959 bushels and Rye 225,903 bushels while Barley shows a decrease of 396,677 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 2,582,479 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 2,353,499 bushels; Oats 111,704 bushels; Flax 111,039 bushels and Rye 25,885 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 39,648 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- An increase is shown in the grain stocks of 228,409 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 189,480 bushels; Oats 37,149 bushels; Barley 943 bushels and Rye 837 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS :- A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 2,020,265 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat and barley of 2,020,424 and 1,325 bushels respectively while Oats show a decrease of 1,484 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).- Grain Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 3,543,470 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 3,457,671 bushels; Oats 512,351 bushels; Flax 65,812 bushels and Rye 24,692 bushels while Barley shows a decrease of 517,056 bushels.

DULUTH:- The receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth during the week ended October 30th, 1926, amounted to Wheat 84,720 bushels, Oats 4,023 bushels, Barley 80,223 bushels; Rye 6,850 bushels, and Flaxseed 5,264 bushels. 
