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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 5th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 5th, 1926, show a net increase of 12,183,753 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 93,434,917 bushels; Oats 9,600,163 bushels; Barley 13,046,201 bushels; Flax 2,008,318 bushels; and Rye 4,199,369 bushels, a total of 122,283,968 bushels. Increases are shown in wheat of 10,712,578 bushels; Oats 662,221 bushels and Barley 1,077,332 bushels, while decreases are noted in Flax and Rye of 67,203 and 206,975 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - An increase is shown in the grain stocks of 6,021,943 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 5,219,657 bushels; Oats 460,276 bushels; Barley 58,329 bushels; Flax 206,913 bushels and Rye 56,268 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - An increase is shown in the grain stocks of 535,909 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 501,577 bushels; Oats 29,462 bushels; Barley 4,308 bushels and Rye 562 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - The grain stocks show an increase of 1,667,359 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,665,943 bushels and Oats 1,441 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - Grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,073,714 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 1,941,711 bushels while decreases are noted in Oats of 137,915 bushels; Barley 467,660 bushels; Flax 81,242 bushels and Rye 181,180 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,801,713 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat and Barley of 827,919 and 1,180,592 bushels respectively, while Oats show a decrease of 6,715 bushels; Flax 196,024 bushels and Rye 4,059 bushels.

the same time, it is also important to take into account the following factors:

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS:- The grain stocks show a net increase of 938,752 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 551,346 bushels; Oats 273,247 bushels and Barley 134,245 bushels, while Rye show a decrease of 20,086 bushels.

DULUTH:- The Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth during the week ended November 6, 1926 amounted to:- Wheat 68,571 bushels; Oats 8,586 bushels; Barley 62,445 bushels; Rye 2,835 bushels; Flaxseed 6,581 bushels. The shipments were by Lake and amounted to Wheat 82,661 bushels; Barley 117,511 bushels and Rye 69,543 bushels.

For the period from August 1, 1926 to November 6, 1926 the receipts were Wheat 717,414 bushels; Oats 51,306 bushels; Barley 459,442 bushels; Rye 61,804 bushels and Flaxseed 28,825 bushels. 


