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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 19th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 19, 1926, show a net increase of 8,239,947 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 112,474,137 bushels; Oats 11,550,042 bushels; Barley 11,968,735 bushels; Flax 2,931,277 bushels and Rye 4,198,720 bushels; a total of 143,122,911 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 7,926,803 bushels; Oats 815,069 bushels; Flax 482,867 and Rye 153,793 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 1,138,585 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- An increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 1,771,229 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 1,225,914 bushels; Oats 364,531 bushels; Barley 97,463 bushels; Flax 54,747 bushels and Rye 28,574 bushels.
