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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 24th, 1926

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 24th, 1926, show a decrease of 4,071,521 bushels. Stocks were as follows:- Wheat 127,297,525 bushels; Oats 14,374,123 bushels; Barley 14,739,671 bushels; Flax 3,224,800 bushels; Rye 4,707,906 bushels, a total of 164,344,030 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the grains:- Wheat 2,865,585 bushels; Oats 353,862 bushels; Barley 40,735 bushels; Flax 220,508 bushels and Rye 590,831 bushels.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 562,540 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 490,903 bushels; Oats 70,366 bushels; Flax 1,622 bushels and Rye 752 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 1,103 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- A decrease is shown in the grain stocks of 1,029,870 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 1,023,479 bushels; Oats 5,604 bushels and Barley 787 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The stocks at the Head of the Lakes show an increase of 4,107,092 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 3,610,848 bushels; Oats 106,296 bushels; Barley 246,537 bushels; Flax 72,264 bushels and Rye 161,147 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- The stocks in store show a net decrease of 2,281,251 bushels from the previous week. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,368,422 bushels; Oats 567,506 bushels; Barley 350,701 bushels and Flax 38,500 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 36,698 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks show a net increase of 155,091 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 183,294 bushels; Barley 6,817 bushels; and Rye 2,294 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 32,873 bushels and 4,441 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U. S. GRAIN).- U. S. grain stocks in Canada show a net increase of 4,629,898 bushels over the same week last year. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,480,182 bushels; Barley 276,263 bushels; Rye 1,352,541 bushels and Corn 2,250,209 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 629,297 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS.- Canadian grain stocks show a decrease of 5,424,722 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 3,704,058 bushels; Oats 64,173 bushels; Barley 683,393 bushels; Flax 204,230 bushels and Rye 768,868 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- The stocks of Canadian grain show a net decrease of 535,044 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,279,652 and Rye 13,458 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 758,066 bushels.

DULUTH.- The receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth during the week ended December 24th, 1926 by rail amounted to 9,977 bushels of Wheat; Oats 421 bushels; Barley 8,488 bushels; Rye 1,977 bushels and Flaxseed 75 bushels. The shipments by rail were 9,381 bushels of Barley and Rye 3,830 bushels.

For the period from August 1st 1926 to December 24th, 1926, the receipts by rail at Duluth were as follows:- Wheat 972,077 bushels; Oats 67,129 bushels; Barley 612,023 bushels; Rye 78,488 bushels and Flaxseed 53,579 bushels. The lake receipts were 16,700 bushels of Flaxseed. The lake shipments were as follows:- Wheat 807,239 bushels; Oats 95,020 bushels; Barley 539,995 bushels; Flaxseed 36,114 bushels and Rye 69,553 bushels. The rail shipments amounted to 10,421 bushels of Wheat; Barley 22,445 bushels; Flaxseed 7,007 bushels and Rye 3,830 bushels.


