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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 21st, 1927

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 21, 1927, show a decrease of 5,670,052 bushels from the previous week. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 126,719,930; Oats 15,082,771; Barley 11,736,167; Flax 3,495,028; Rye 4,964,358; a total of 161,998,254 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,268,964; Oats 100,497; Barley 1,862,929; Flax 290,290 and Rye 147,372 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,392,556 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,243,452; Barley 191,255 and Rye 8,713, while Oats and Flax show increases of 36,080 and 14,784 bushels respectively.



INTERNAL TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- A net decrease of 87,909 bushels is shown in the grain stocks. Wheat shows a decrease of 104,295 bushels, while increases are noted in Oats of 14,518; Barley 1,270 and Flax 598 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- A net decrease of 47,413 bushels is shown in the grain stocks. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 35,697 and Oats 14,235 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 2,519 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 2,504,580 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 2,592,705; Flax 34,735 and Rye 94,631 bushels, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 4,766 and 212,725 bushels respectively.




