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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 28TH, 1927.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 28th, 1927, show a net decrease of 5,495,373 bushels from the previous week. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 12,129,851 bushels; Oats 15,052,939 bushels; Barley 11,819,400 bushels; Flax 3,550,213 bushels; Rye 4,950,508 bushels, a total of 158,502,911 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,590,079 bushels; Oats 29,832 bushels and Rye 13,850 bushels, while Barley and Flax show increases of 83,233 bushels and 55,185 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Grain stocks show a net decrease of 840,606 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 807,050 bushels; Barley 40,236 bushels; Flax 5,703 bushels; and Rye 18,002 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 30,385 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - A net decrease of 8,365 bushels is shown in the grain stocks. Wheat and Barley show decreases of 20,835 bushels and 1,681 bushels, respectively, while increases are noted in Oats of 9,247 bushels, Flax 3,919 bushels and Rye 985 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - A net increase of 10,051 bushels is shown in the grain stocks. Wheat shows an increase of 13,746 bushels, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 3,266 bushels and 429 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (F.W. WILLIAM AND P.T. ARTHUR). - A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 1,597,057 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,596,091 bushels; Flax 68,032 bushels and Rye 85,611 bushels, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 33,828 bushels and 315,949 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,293,871 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,198,073 bushels; Oats 139,165 bushels and Flax 10,800 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 41,499 bushels and 12,668 bushels respectively.
