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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 11th, 1927.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 11th, 1927, show a net decrease of 1,180,279 bushels from the previous week. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 118,630,083 bushels; Oats 14,956,476 bushels; Barley 12,173,198 bushels; Flax 3,616,924 bushels; Rye 5,057,871 bushels; a total of 154,434,552 bushels. A decrease of 1,766,412 bushels is noted in Wheat, while increases are shown in Oats of 71,276 bushels; Barley 119,835 bushels; Flax 46,399 bushels and Rye 348,623 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks show a net increase of 148,432 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats of 89,726 bushels; Barley 52,152 bushels and Rye 17,389 bushels, while Wheat and Flax show decreases of 10,679 bushels and 156 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS ( SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 79,943 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 72,848 bushels; Oats 2,759 bushels and Barley 6,368 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 2,032 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - A decrease is shown in the grain stocks of 149,735 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 146,332 bushels; Oats 1,959 bushels and Barley 1,444 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 105,485 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats of 4,285 bushels; Barley 17,535 bushels; Flax 47,637 bushels and Rye 54,104 bushels, while Wheat shows a decrease of 18,076 bushels.






